b.	Balochistan	 On 7 – 8 August 2020, flash flooding due to heavy rains reported in districts Khuzdar, Jhal Magsi, Lasbela, Gwadar, Pasni, Kachi, Dera Bugti and surrounding areas. Following damages are reported till now: - Sambli Dam in Karkh, District Khuzdar damaged. 25-30 villages and link roads in District Jhal Magsi were affected by flood water entered from District Khuzdar. 70x stranded person in Moola River, District Khuzdar were evacuated by Levies Force and District Administration and shifted at Moola Rest House. 1x Bridge at Pasni, District Gwadar on Makran Coastal Highway collapsed. Traffic suspended. Sibi to Kohlu road blocked due to land sliding. Quetta to Jacobabad traffic suspended due to high level flooding. Bibi Nani Bridge in District Bolan partially damaged. Traffic suspended. Gas pipe line in District Bolan area reported damaged due to flood water. 8x deaths and 142 houses completely damaged in Balochistan. 1100x tents, blankets, plastic mats, jerry cans, hygiene kits, charpoy, mattress, pillows and solar lights, 700x kitchen sets and 6x de-watering pumps distributed by DDMAs in affectees.

7. <u>Weather Forecast for Next 24 Hours</u>. Scattered thunderstorm / rain of moderate intensity with Isolated Heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Malakand, Hazara, D. I. Khan, Makran, Rawalpindi & Gujranawala Divisions. Isolated thunderstorm / rain is expected over rest of the Punjab, Balochistan & Khyber Pakhtunkhwa along with South & Southeast Sindh. Rainfall activity of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls and few very heavy falls is expected during next 72 Hours and decrease thereafter. Last 24 hours significant rainfall recorded is attached as Annex B.

8. <u>Weather Advisory / Press Release</u>. PMD has issued a Weather Advisory on 7 August 2020 that a monsoon low pressure now lies over Sindh and likely to move westwards over Balochistan during Friday evening / night. Under the influence of this weather system strong monsoon currents are expected to penetrate in Balochistan from Friday (evening) to Sunday (morning). Following is expected: -

- a. More rain / wind-thundershower are expected in most parts of Balochistan from Friday to Sunday morning. Heavy falls are expected in Kalat, Khuzdar, Lasbella, Awaran, Panjgur, Kech and Gwadar during the period.
- b. Sea condition would remain rough to very rough along Sindh Makran coast. Fisher man are advised not to venture in open sea during the period.

9. <u>Flood Warning / Alert</u>. Heavy downpour may generate Flash Flooding in the Hill Torrents of Eastern Balochistan and Nullahs / Rivers of Coastal Balochistan during next 24 Hours.
